(Be) suppose to

supposed to = should = ought to = had better

The present of (be)supposed to:

am/is/are supposed to +infinitive

➤ **He is supposed to be at the meeting now. (should)**

He should be at the meeting now.

➤ **You are not supposed to park here .(should)**

You shouldn't park here.

Supposed → future

- We use am/is/are supposed to in the future too :I must hurry. I'm supposed to take the 7 o'clock train to Luxor.

Supposed → past

- We use was/were supposed to in the past too:
And this means that he ought to do something but he didn't do it.

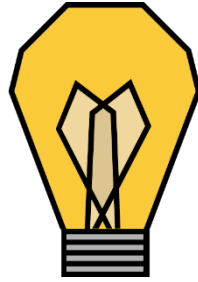
- We were supposed to give a party last week, but we didn't. (should)

We should have given a party last week, but we didn't.

- He should have studied hard. (supposed)

He was supposed to study hard.
